### **Keeping Children Healthy**

There has been a lot of news lately about influenza and the effect it can have on our health. The Auckland Regional Public Health Service has put together a list of the best things you can do to stop the spread of any type of influenza virus. They are:

- Stay at home and away from others if you are sick
- Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue
- Put used tissues into a rubbish bin
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth- germs spread that way
- Be careful to wash hands often with soap and dry them thoroughly-hand hygiene is crucial: even when you start to feel better there is still a risk of infecting others, so keep to the **20/20 rule** 20 seconds washing and 20 seconds drying
- Keep surfaces clean at home, school and work
