<p>Treasure Seekers</p> <p>Go outside to hide treasure. Draw a Birdseye view map of your house and place an 'X' where you have hidden your treasure. Now give your whānau the map to see if they can find the treasure.</p>	<p>Hand Span</p> <p>Use your hands as a measuring tool. Measure as many objects around your house. Write your data down. See if someone can do this in your bubble too. Compare the data!</p>	<p>Catapult Fun</p> <p>Design and build a catapult with household items. Test your accuracy and power by knocking over a few plastic bottles.</p>	<p>Bird Watcher</p> <p>See how many different types of birds you see when you go for a walk, look outside the window or go outside to play.</p>
<p>Fathers Day Craft</p> <p>Make a card or something special for dad / uncle / papa by using items around your house. Give it to them on Sunday or give it to them the next time you see them.</p>	<p>Scientist</p> <p>Can you create your own experiment using white vinegar and baking soda!</p>	<p>Shadow People</p> <p>Go outside and 'find' your shadow. Use rocks, leaves, bottle tops to use as eyes, hair, a mouth and nose and stick it on you shadow's face. Take a photo!</p>	<p>Scavenger Hunt Sketch</p> <p>Go outside and draw a picture of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a tree • your house • a car <p>Take a photo of your sketch and email it to your teacher.</p>
<p>Obstacle Course</p> <p>Create an obstacle outside. See who can run around your obstacle the fastest.</p>	<p>Jump Jam</p> <p>Get outdoors. Play your favourite song. Make up a routine to the song to create your own Jump Jam dance! Be creative but repeat your actions. Keep practising your routine until you have memorised it. Now see if your whānau can 'move and groove' along with you.</p>	<p>Builder</p> <p>Use recycled materials to build a mini town or city. Take a photo of your city and write a story about it. What is it called? Where is your city located?</p>	<p>Backyardigan</p> <p>Explore your back or front yard looking for insects. What did you find? Draw a picture of the insects you were able to see. Don't disturb them - remember to be kind.</p>
<p>Toy Maker</p> <p>Create a toy puppet out of an old sock. Add some eyes, clothes and hair using things around the house. Be creative as you can!</p>	<p>My Whānau</p> <p>Draw a picture of your family members and write about how important they are to you.</p>	<p>Reading Fort</p> <p>Build a reading fort using sheets or blankets in or outside your house. Remember to ask your big people to help. Bring in your toys and read or play in there.</p>	<p>Gamer</p> <p>Design and make your own game. Create your own game board, pieces, rules and play it with the whānau!</p>
