School Times

The first bell goes at 8.15am – this is the time that children should start arriving at school. Children arriving earlier than this sit on the seats outside Rms 15-22 until the bell goes at 8.15am.

School starts Morning Interval Lunchtime **8.55am 10.40 - 11am 12.30 - 1.20pm** (Lunch is eaten between 1.05pm and 1.20pm)

School finishes at 2.50pm

All students should be picked up as soon as possible after 2.50pm. If you are going to be later than 3.05pm, please let the school office know. All children should be out of the school by 3.15pm at the latest. No supervision is available before 8.15am and after 3.15pm.

What's Going On.....

If you have come in to school, you will see that the administration block is under repair. This will take about 20 weeks to complete. The school office is now in the Portacom on the end of the field. Please try and avoid using Pukeora Rd to get in to the school and *do not park inside the carpark*. There will be trucks and workmen moving around the construction area and it is not a safe area to be walking through. Please use the path around the area if you do come in this gate.

The best entry points to our school during the construction are from Fairburn Rd or Petrie Place. A reminder that our school has regular visits from both the police and the Auckland City Traffic Wardens. They will be looking to see all vehicles are parked legally and that all children are wearing seatbelts and the correct booster seats. A number of people were angry and upset last year when they received tickets for parking illegally. The only way to avoid getting a ticket is to make sure you park legally.

Otahuhu is working to be a "*Truant Free Area*". The local schools, the Business Association, the Police and Truancy Services will be working together to ensure that students are at school when school is open. Absences from school mean your child misses important learning!
