## Otahuhu Schools' Cultural Festival (updated)

## Starship School Swap – "Phones for Rewards Scheme"

We have just re-registered to be part of this programme. The programme works by us collecting as many old unused or broken mobile phones as possible to donate to Starship Hospital. They then turn these phones in to cash through recycling them. This enables them to fundraise and help children around the whole country. Your children are asked to collect as many old phones (with the owner's permission – of course) and add them to our collection. We will then convert the points we get for them in to "rewards" such as interactive whiteboards, projectors, cameras etc. The more phones we collect, the more points we have to get things for our students to use at school.

#### Fairburn School Dress Code

Our school "dress code" sets out the basic requirements. In particular, the two following parts are of concern to us at the moment -1. Children should not wear make-up or cosmetics to school unless it is necessary for medical or cultural reasons. 2. Children should not wear jewellery to school, except for studs and watches, unless the item of jewellery has a religious, cultural or medical significance.
