Keeping Ourselves Safe Parent Meeting Wednesday 25th May

We will be teaching a unit of work called *Keeping Ourselves Safe* that is focused on the health and safety of our students. Before this work begins, we want to talk to parents about the content of this programme. It covers a wide range of topics and includes a section on sexual and physical abuse. This programme is taught in all NZ schools every second year as part of the NZ Health Curriculum. The programme has been designed jointly by educators and the police. There will be homework tasks for families to do during the unit of work so that parents are aware of the things that children are learning. The meeting will be held in the school hall at 3pm.

On 15 June, we will be inviting parents in to our classrooms to see the work that students have done during the Space Topic they have been studying. This will start around 11am and go over the lunch hour. More information will come home closer to the time.

Kai Baskets

In term 1, our year 5&6 classes successfully trialed the idea of having a Kai basket in their classroom. On most days we have children who either would appreciate more food to eat at lunchtime, or children who have lots of food and are unable to eat it all. Children who have extra food have often

said that they would like to share it rather than take it back home or throw it away. By providing a Kai Basket in each classroom, children could either contribute food or take it, and there would not be any pressure for children to do either. At Fairburn School we promote our school values as part of our daily lives. This is a good way of reinforcing and "living" the values of kindness and consideration. Because this has been successful in Years 5&6, in the next few weeks we would like to have them in every classroom. Please could you talk to your child about the Kai Basket and if you have any further ideas or concerns please contact the school.
